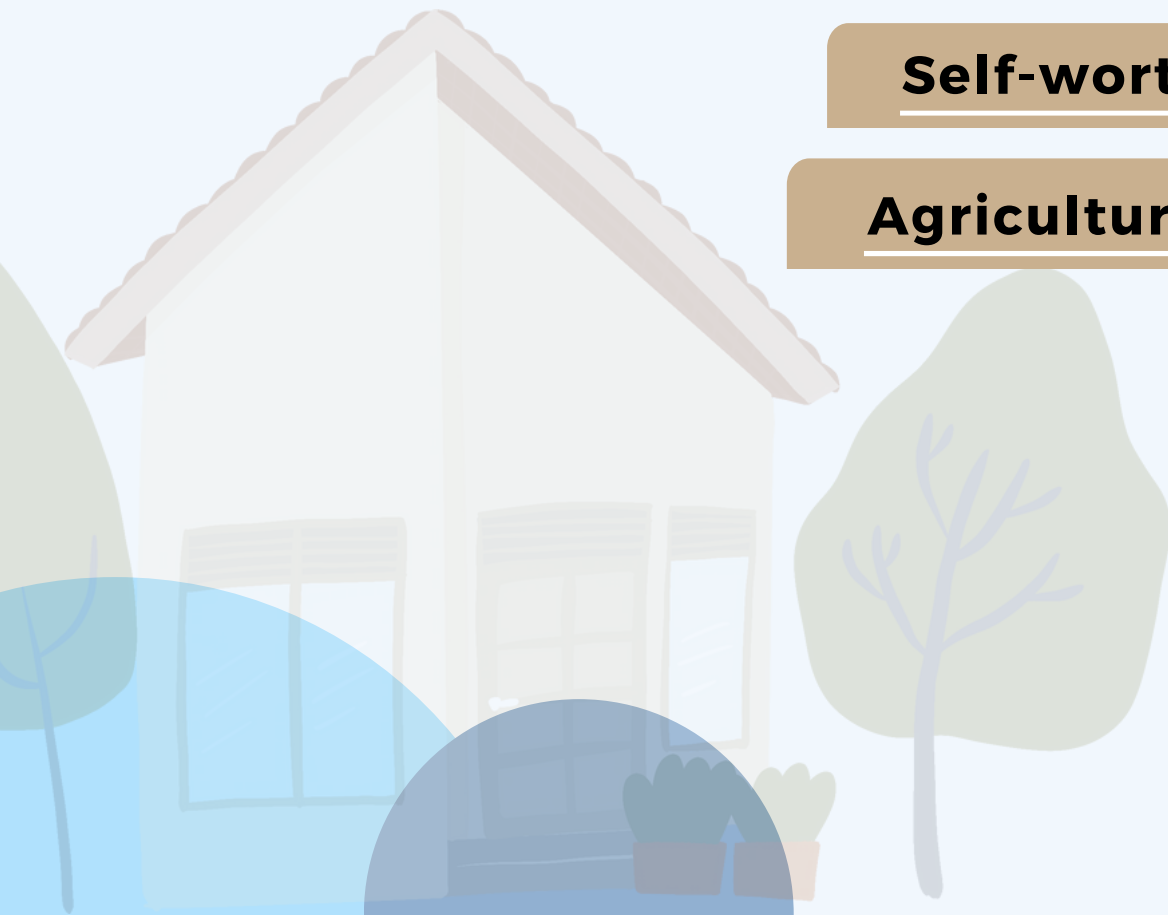

ACHIEVEMENTS

1. Business and Enterprise Discussion

We are delighted to share the progress of the Mushroom Promotion activity initiated by the Sathi Project in pursuit of enhancing economic opportunities for women in our project area. A pivotal training session led by Ms. Chetana Pawar on 5th March 2024 proved immensely valuable. 30 participants were equipped with essential techniques in cutting and sterilizing paddy/wheat straw for mushroom spawn bag filling, fostering practical skills crucial for successful cultivation. Emphasizing sustainability, Ms. Pawar advocated for minimizing chemical usage and maintaining proper hygienic conditions throughout the cultivation process, ensuring high-quality mushroom production. This initiative not only empowers women with new skills but also fosters economic independence within the community, aligning with our shared vision of sustainable development and empowerment.



2. Women's Day Celebration



On the occasion of International Women's Day, a momentous event unfolded at Kone, Trimbak, organized under the auspices of the Sathi project on 7th March 2024. Ms. Ashlesha Deo delivered a compelling speech, illuminating the significance of the day while advocating for gender equality and women's empowerment. Her address, attended by over 150 women from Sapte, Kone, Dhumodi, and Torangan villages, resonated deeply, reflecting the collective spirit of progress and resilience. Following Ms. Deo's impactful words, a health check-up camp, facilitated by Guruji Hospital, prioritized women's well-being, offering essential medical services and screenings. The event further showcased collaborative efforts, as Mr. Pavan Chandrattare from Finolex reaffirmed the commitment of organizations and individuals towards women's welfare and community development. Such initiatives underscore our dedication to fostering inclusive growth and empowerment within our project area.



3. Women's Day Celebration

Event: Mahila Melava (Women's Convention)

Project: Navnirman project

Objective: To provide a platform for women entrepreneurs to share their entrepreneurial journey and experiences.

Participants: 18 women from Dhumodi and Torangan

Project Support: The women were taken to the event under the Sathi project to expose them to various entrepreneurial ideas.

Event Report: The Mahila Melava, organized by TDK Ltd and Saukhyam Arogya Foundation, brought together over 150 women entrepreneurs engaged in farm and non-farm livelihoods. The event provided a platform for these women to share their experiences, fostering a strong sense of community and support. Heart-touching stories revealed the gratitude of the women towards the organization and donors for their timely support. Informal connections formed among attendees resulted in mutual support for families in distress. Practical assistance, including handholding for 28 families and the distribution of reusable sanitary napkins, demonstrated a commitment to sustainable empowerment. Through networking opportunities and knowledge enhancement on various topics, including health and financial literacy, the event empowered women to make informed decisions for themselves and their families. Distinguished guests, including representatives from Rajya Ekal Mahila Samiti and Saukhyam Arogya Foundation, along with CSR leads from TDK Ltd, further enriched the event with their presence and insights.



4. Mushroom Promotion

Number of Women: 70 women were provided with training and support.

Types of Mushrooms: Oyester (Dhingri)

Participant detail:

20 were trained in Kone mushroom cultivation.

30 were trained in Sapte mushroom cultivation.

10 were trained in Dhumodi mushroom cultivation.

10 were trained in Torangan mushroom cultivation.

Price of Mushrooms: The mushrooms are being sold for Rs. 200 per kilogram.
