Mission Cerebral Palsy –
CP Assessment Camp
31st Jan & 1st Feb 2025

In November 2015, the CEO of the Satara District in Maharashtra, Nitin Patil, brought our attention to a special cause. During a survey, they identified 313 children diagnosed with Cerebral Palsy in the entire Satara district. These children needed support with special school chairs. We specially designed Cerebral Palsy chairs and responded as soon as we could, with 100 units for their Ziila Parishad schools.

During this project, we realised that these children needed much more support to enhance their lives and find inclusion in mainstream schools, in keeping with the district's policy of inclusive education. This led to the birth of an initiative close to our hearts – Mission Cerebral Palsy. This movement is dedicated to supporting children with CP in a holistic manner, in every aspect of their lives, to make them mobile, independent and self-reliant.



We received wholehearted support and funding from Finolex Industries and medical support and interventions from Sancheti Hospital, Bharati Hospital, Sassoon General Hospital, KEM Hospital, Deenanath Mangeshkar Hospital, HV Desai Eye Hospital and Ruby Hall Clinic in Pune. Like-minded teams and consent from the parents of these children, support from education officers and authorities over the years have been encouraging to make this endeavour successful and inclusive.

Mission Cerebral Palsy by MMF has seen the establishment of 9 rehabilitation centres (with two more planned) across Maharashtra and Gujarat, supporting the needs of over 150 patients who visit once or twice a week. Regular assessment camps are also organised, where apart from surgery and therapy, orthotics are also provided. .

Mission CP, which began in 2015 and remains close to our hearts, continues to make a difference even today.

Target Population: - Poor and marginalized women and adolescent girls from Budgam district J&K.

Objectives of the Project

To enable the trainees to engage in gainful and sustainable livelihood activity through vocational training in cutting and tailoring and traditional hand embroidery.

To build their capacity for economic self-reliance and provide support in establishing forward and backward linkages.

·To bring in the needed technology and develop needed infrastructure to create livelihood opportunities for women in Jammu and Kashmir

Outcome

·100 participant from Budgam would be trained in cutting & tailoring and traditional hand embroidery skills and management training relevant to their livelihood.

·These women will develop all self-employment and business-related technical and managerial skills in sustainable livelihood creation and socio-cultural development through activities in garment designing & stitching.

Inauguration of Well Renovation at Saylawas Jail, Jaipur. 7th February, 2025

Access to clean water is a basic human right. Yet, in the absence of sustainable water solutions, many institutional facilities face ongoing challenges in securing this necessity.

Recognising this need and responding to an appeal from Special Central Jail in Saylawas, Rajasthan, Mukul Madhav Foundation (MMF), the CSR partner of Finolex Industries Limited (FIL), addressed a critical issue where hundreds of inmates and staff depended on costly water tankers. To create a long term, self sustaining solution, we revived a disused well within the jail premises, ensuring a consistent water source, reducing monthly expenses, and supporting afforestation efforts.

Beyond this initiative, FIL-MMF actively supports jails and prisoners in multiple ways, including:

Canteen support, Farming initiatives, Health camps Providing equipment such as printers and computers and other, Plumbing courses in Gujarat.

The project was inaugurated on January 27, 2025, in the presence of esteemed dignitaries, including Ms. Monika Agarwal Ji, Director Inspector General of Police, Rajasthan Jail Department; Mr. Shourabh Swami, Superintendent of Police; Mr. Rajesh Dukiya, the Jailer; and Mr. Lavkush Gurjar, Industry Incharge, Jaipur Jail Department.

This initiative reflects MMF's commitment to fostering self-reliance, sustainability, and rehabilitation. By addressing fundamental needs, we are steadfast in our mission to empower communities and create lasting change.



Digital Literacy Program in Kanpur. 10th February, 2025

Empowering Young Minds Through Digital Literacy!
We are delighted to share that Finolex Industries Limited (FIL), in partnership with Mukul Madhav Foundation (MMF), has collaborated with FICCI FLO Kanpur Chapter to launch a Digital Literacy Program at Nagar Nigam School, Sarvodaya Nagar, Kanpur.

On February 10, 2025, FIL/MMF officially signed an agreement with FICCI FLO Kanpur Chapter, marking the beginning of this impactful initiative aimed at equipping young students with essential digital skills in the presence of Nalini Sanwal Chairperson, Arushi Tondon Treasurer, Kriti Shrof Sr. Vice chair of FICCI FLO Kanpur Chapter, Ritu P. Chhabria – Managing Trustee Mukul Madhav Foundation and team.



Through this program, 105 children will gain access to technology-driven learning, empowering them with the knowledge and confidence to thrive in today's digital world. This initiative reflects our shared commitment to bridging the digital divide and fostering education-driven empowerment at the grassroots level. We look forward to seeing these young minds flourish with the power of digital literacy!



Turtle Conservation at Gaonkhadi Beach, Ratnagiri. 12th February, 2025

FIL-MMF, in collaboration with the Forest Department, is actively participating in the conservation of Olive Ridley turtles at Gaonkhadi Beach, Ratnagiri. Due to increasing environmental threats, many turtle eggs face risks from poaching, predation, and habitat destruction. To address this, over 4,000 turtle eggs were safely relocated to a hatchery to ensure higher survival rates. Volunteers and experts monitored the nests, ensuring optimal hatching conditions. Witnessing the baby turtles return to the ocean was a proud and emotional moment for the entire team. This initiative not only helps protect an endangered species but also raises awareness among local communities about biodiversity conservation. FIL-MMF aims to continue similar projects to protect marine ecosystems and encourage sustainable practices.



Thalassemia & Diabetes Awareness Session. 13th February, 2025.

We organise awareness sessions on Thalassemia followed by thalassemia testing/screening in various colleges along lengths and breadth of Ratnagiri and Pune districts. We also offer them counselling sessions and prescribe medication for anaemia, sickle cell and iron deficiency issues.

We support young thalassemia patients with monthly blood transfusions, filters, and medication, collaborating with the Thalassemia Society Pune Chapter, Bharati Hospital, Indian Red Cross, and the Wishing Factory. We have enabled thalassemia patients to learn how to make rakhis as part of our income generation programme and offered scholarships for their education. So far, we have supported 19+ colleges in Pune, Satara, Jalgoan and Ratnagiri, with 4000+ students attending these sessions. We completed 4500+ blood tests and identified 52 minor students, and we provided counseling and medication by healthcare expert.

Today FIL/MMF conducted a Thalassemia and Diabetic awareness session at Sane Guruji Aryurvedic college for PG doctor and nursing team total 200 students attended session and 175 blood tests were done

River Cleanup Drive, Pune. 14th February, 2025

FIL-MMF, in collaboration with Worship Earth Foundation, conducted a river cleanup drive to restore the natural ecosystem of the Mula and Mutha Rivers in Pune. With increasing pollution levels, river health has deteriorated, impacting both marine life and human communities. Volunteers collected waste, removed plastic debris, and spread awareness about the importance of water conservation. Engaging local communities in this initiative fosters a sense of collective responsibility for maintaining clean water bodies. This cleanup drive is part of FIL-MMF's broader environmental commitment to promoting sustainable practices and encouraging eco-friendly habits among citizens.

Blanket & Socks Distribution in Tripura. 14th February, 2025

FIL-MMF, in partnership with Yuva Vikash Kendra, distributed blankets and socks to orphaned children in Kumarghat, Tripura. With harsh winters posing significant health risks, this initiative aimed to provide warmth and comfort to over 100 children. Many of these children lack proper winter clothing, making them vulnerable to illnesses. FIL-MMF's continuous social welfare efforts ensure that underprivileged children receive the necessary support to improve their quality of life.





Support for Differently-Abled Couples. 17th February 2025.

FIL-MMF extended its support to differently-abled couples by providing essential household items, including cupboards and furniture, to enhance their living conditions. Many of these couples face financial challenges and lack access to basic necessities. This initiative promotes dignity and stability in their lives. Additionally, FIL-MMF continues its monthly aid to over 60 institutions supporting individuals with disabilities. By addressing their fundamental needs and advocating for inclusivity, the organization strengthens social support systems for differently-abled individuals.



Mammography Camp for Women's Health – Ongoing.

Total screening done is 48

A one mammography camp was conducted by Mukul Madhav Foundation and Finolex Industries Limited in collaboration with Bharati Hospital where a total of 23 screenings and testing's were done. Tests included Gynaecologists' Consultancy, Pap Smear, Mammography, Sono Mammography, CBC (Complete Blood Count) and HIV, Dietician Consultation, Blood Pressure, Height, Weight Measurement. This is a monthly camp for women over the age of 35.
